I. Call to Order

The May Supervisory Committee meeting was called to order by Pieter Van Ry, SPR Director. Director Van Ry welcomed everyone to the meeting.

II. Consideration of Minutes for Previous Supervisory Committee Meetings

ACTION TAKEN – The Supervisory Committee considered the recommendation to approve the April 30, 2026, Supervisory Committee meeting minutes.

Committee Member Lewis moved to approve the minutes, Committee Member Rachael seconded the motion, four ayes, and zero nays. Minutes approved.

IV. Informational Items

SPR staff discussed these informational items with the Committee:

- Director's Update
 - Blair Corning, SPR Deputy Director – Environmental Programs, provided an update on the recent National Water Research Institute report evaluating Colorado's proposed nutrient regulations under Regulation 31. The report supports establishing nutrient limits based on what is realistically achievable at wastewater treatment plants and emphasizes practical, cost-effective approaches rather than relying on advanced treatment technologies or excessive chemical addition. SPR staff continue to participate in the stakeholder work group regarding implementation and feasibility.
 - Jamie Eichenberger, SPR Deputy Director – Engineering, highlighted ongoing collaboration between the Engineering and O&M divisions to address operational challenges. Current efforts include evaluating the transition from three (3) operating trickling filters to two (2) to improve efficiency and reduce operational issues, as well as developing a dedicated polymer feed system for the DAFT facility to improve reliability. These projects also provide valuable hands-on experience for SPR engineering staff.
 - Izaiah Kruenegel, SPR Deputy Director – O&M, recapped a recent farm tour that provided employees and partners with an opportunity to learn more about SPR's farming operations, equipment, and land application program. The tour emphasized the importance and complexity of the farm operation while increasing awareness and understanding of this critical utility function across the organization.
 - Director Van Ry discussed next steps in the governance analysis process. Study Sessions with the Englewood and Littleton City Councils are tentatively scheduled for July 27 and 28, 2026. The revised schedule

still aligns with plans to discuss the topic at the Joint Council meeting in August.

- **SPR Influent Flow and Load Summary**
 - The measured flow to SPR averaged 18.8 mgd in April 2026, which is 0.3 mgd less than April 2025's flow. The measured ten (10)-month average flow split was 42.4 / 57.6 percent between the Cities of Littleton and Englewood.
- **SPR Voluntary Incentive Program Summary**
 - SPR has received 9.7 years of credits and is on track to receive the full extension of 10 years. As of April 2026, SPR has achieved 0 days toward its target treatment goals for Total Inorganic Nitrogen and 6 days for Total Phosphorus.
- **SPR Pipeline Injection System Summary**
 - As of March 2026, SPR received \$217,435 in year-to-date net revenue on the Pipeline Injection System.
- **Fiscal Management and Reporting**
 - Director Van Ry presented the financial report and aggregate purchases report for April 2026.
